## HONG KONG MERCHANT SHIPPING INFORMATION NOTE

## Unified Interpretations on the Protocol of 1988 relating to the International Convention on Load Lines, 1966

To: Shipowners, Ship Managers, Ship Operators, Ship Masters, Classification Societies and Shipbuilders

## Summary

The purpose of this Note is to promulgate the unified interpretations on the Protocol of 1988 relating to the International Convention on Load Lines, 1966 with a view to facilitating global and consistent implementation of requirements concerning sill and coaming heights for openings on top of deckhouses and companionways, and including text of regulations 27(13)(e) and 37(3) of the 1988 Load Lines Protocol.

This Note supersedes the Hong Kong Merchant Shipping Information Note No. 55/2016 issued on 7 December 2016.

- 1. The Maritime Safety Committee (MSC) of the International Maritime Organization (IMO), at its 105<sup>th</sup> session in April 2022, approved the circular MSC.1/Circ.1535/Rev.2 proclaiming the unified interpretations on the Protocol of 1988 relating to the International Convention on Load Lines, 1966 with a view to facilitating global and consistent implementation of requirements concerning sill and coaming heights for openings on top of deckhouses and companionways, and including text of regulations 27(13)(e) and 37(3) of the 1988 Load Lines Protocol.
