Safe Mooring Operation

When a Chinese registered river trade container vessel was mooring at

Kwai Chung Container Terminal, a crewmember was struck by a parted

mooring rope, fell overboard, and drowned.

2. The investigation revealed that the master did not check and confirm

that the ropes at the stern had been let go before attempting to manoeuvre the

vessel away from the berth highlighting a lack of communication among the

team members during mooring operations.

3. To avoid recurrence of similar accidents, the attention of owners and

masters of all vessels are drawn to the following important advice:-

Effective communication arrangement must be maintained

between the mooring team and the master on the bridge of a

vessel at all times during berthing/unberthing operations; and

The Master must ensure all mooring ropes are let go before

manoeuvering the vessel off the berth.

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
