(Navigational and Seamanship Safety Practices)

**Notice to Coxswains and Operators of Vessels** 

A local passenger ferry hit a mooring dolphin inside Cheung Chau Typhoon Shelter

soon after the vessel had departed from Cheung Chau ferry pier. In the accident, a number

of passengers and crew members were injured while the ferry sustained damage to her

starboard bow.

2. The investigation into the incident is still in progress. The preliminary findings of

the investigation attribute the causes of accident to improper look-out and over-speeding.

3. Coxswains and Operators of vessels are hereby reminded that:

vessels shall always maintain a proper look-out by all available means to

prevent the vessel from colliding with other vessels, objects and/or mooring

facilities which may be lit or unlit. When risk of collision exists, early

actions should be taken to avoid collision so as to pass clear at a safe distance;

and

vessels shall always proceed at a safe speed appropriate to the prevailing

circumstances and conditions. When navigating inside typhoon shelter, the

speed limit of 5 knots shall be strictly observed.
